OPTOMETRY

Optometry is a health care profession concerned with the health of the eyes and related structures, vision, visual systems, and vision information processing in humans. Optometrists are trained to prescribe the Spectacle or Contact Lens or Low vision devices to improve vision, and to diagnose and treat various eye diseases, In the United States and Canada optometrists are Doctors of Optometry and are held to the same legal standards as any physician. In all U.S States Optometrists are licenced to diagnose and treat diseases of the eye through topical diagnostic and therapeutic drugs. Doctors of Optometry are also able to perform certain types of laser surgery in some states, In India and other Countries patients are reffered to other health care professionals. Such as ophthamologists for further treatment or investigation





Demand for Optometrists in India

India has approximatley 6000 qualified Optometrists which is grossly inadequate for the 1 billion population. Ideally at least 50,000 qualified Optometrists are required to achieve the objective of providing Optimum eye care to the Population of India.

Personal Satisfaction: Optometry provides the satisfaction of helping people to improve the quality of their lives

Income: It is one of the ten income earning profession in INDIA, U.S.A, U. A.E and other foreign countries

Flexiblity: In spite of being a respectable profession in the medical field, Optometrists have limited working hours and few emergencies enabling them to easily integrate their personal lives with their professional responsibilites.

Responsibilites of an Optometrist

- To conduct primary examination of the eye
- To conduct diagnostic tests for the diagnosis of eye disease and subsequent referral to Eye Surgeons.
- To prescribe remedial treatment in the form of spectacles, contact lenses and low vision devices.
- To Provide community outreach and public health services (e.g. vision screening in schools, colleges, offices and industries).
- To manage visual problems related to work conditions and professional health hazards, (e.g. Computer vision Syndrome).
- To counsel and help in rehabilitation of patients with partial vision, colour vision defects and other hereditary ocular defects.
- To counsel patients and prepare them for eye surgeries, lasers and other procedures for referral to Ophthamologists.
- To assist Ophthalmologists in clinical and surgical procedures.
- Decides power of IOL, does field study, & helps in Orthoptics & Ortho- optic excercise.







MSW (Mental Health)



Clinically trained social workers are the nation's largest group of mental health service providers. Social work is considered one of the five core mental health professions by federal law and National Institutes of Health. With more than 200,000 in the field, there are more clinical social workers than psychologists, psychiatrists, and psychiatric nurses combined.

WHO ARE SOCIAL WORKERS?

Social workers are highly trained professionals working to improve the quality of life and well-being of others through direct practice, crisis intervention, research, community organizing, policy change, advocacy, and educational programs. Social workers are dedicated to the pursuit of social justice and strive to help those affected by poverty, disabilities, illnesses, divorce, unemployment, and other personal problems and social disadvantages.

Being a social worker requires extensive knowledge of human behavior and development, as well as social, cultural, and economic institutions and the ways in which they interact. Most social workers will hold at least a bachelor's degree in social work or related field, though many (especially clinicians) will hold a master's degree and valid license to practice.

A good social worker will often possess a high degree of compassion and empathy, a passion for helping others, strong interpersonal and problem-solving skills, and good listening and organizational skills.

WHY SOCIAL WORK IS IN DEMAND

According to the United States Bureau of Labor and Statistics, overall employment of social workers is expected to grow at a rate of 19% between 2012 and 2022. The demand for health care social workers is expected to grow by as much as 27% during this same time period—a rate much higher than the average growth rate for all occupations. One reason for the increase in demand is due to the aging of the baby boomers, who will soon need long-term care and assistance.

Social workers in the mental health and substance abuse fields will also be in high demand, with a 23% increase in employment expected by 2022. More people are expected to seek mental health treatment, and people who have a substance addiction are increasingly sent to treatment programs rather than jails or prisons.





Nutrition & Dietetics





Dietitians: They plan, monitor, and supervise the diet for patients (with medical conditions like diabetes, food allergies, gastro-intestinal disorders etc.) across hospitals, clinics, health centres, sports centres or their own private clinics. Dietitians are responsible for recommending proper as well as corrective food and eating habits, while taking into account the patient's health, lifestyle, age, potential allergies and food preferences.

To be a dietitian, you need to have compulsorily completed a bachelors and/or Masters/PG diploma degree in Dietetics (in which nutrition can be an added subject.) Some countries like USA/Canada require dietitians to clear an additional exam after their education in order to qualify to get a licence/registration to practice.

Nutritionists: They can't plan diets for patients with medical problems. However they do help people achieve better health by advising on health and food choices. Their expertise lies in public health nutrition, community health, and tertiary education related to nutrition. Nutritionists can go into research as well as work as nutrition consultants and advisors, public health and health promotion officers, community development officers, quality and nutrition coordinators, food technologists etc.

A nutritionist can upgrade herself to become a dietician by studying the required dietetics course and getting a license (only in some countries)

NUTRITION AND DIETETICS CAREERS

There are different types of dietitian positions: clinical dietitians, community dietitians, management dietitians, and consultant dietitians. Each of these positions offers different career options, such as food nutrition services in hospitals, nutrition counselling in public health agencies and fitness clubs or clinical management in food service systems.

TASKS

Common tasks of nutritionist or dietician include-

Scientific study of nutrition and food science

Provide guidance on eating habits and nutrition to people

Plant diets according to the needs of patient/client

Conduct or take part in research activity (depending upon qualification)

Though nutritionists and dieticians share many common tasks, an RD (Registered Dietician) is more like an allied healthcare professional.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS AND REGULATIONS

1. STANDARD OF PASSING AND AWARD OF DIVISION:

- a. Students shall have a minimum of 40% of total marks of the University examinations in each subject. The overall passing minimum is 40% both in aggregate of Continuous Internal Assessment and external in each subject.
- b. The minimum marks for passing in each theory / Lab course shall be 40% of the marks prescribed for the paper / lab.
- c. A candidate who secures 40% or more marks but less than 50% of the aggregate marks prescribed for four years taken together, shall be awarded THIRD CLASS.
- d. A candidate who secures 40% or more marks but less than 60% of the aggregate marks prescribed for four years taken together, shall be awarded SECOND CLASS.
- e. A candidate who secures 60% or more of the aggregate marks prescribed for four years taken together, shall be awarded FIRST CLASS.
- f. Only Part-III subjects were considered for the ranking.
- g. The Practical / Project shall be assessed by the two examiners, by an internal examiner and an external examiner.

2. CONTINUOUS INTERNAL ASSESSMENT:

- a. Continuous Internal Assessment for each paper shall be by means of Written Tests, A ssignments, Class tests and Seminars.
- b. 25 marks allotted for the Continuous Internal assessment is distributed for Written Test, Assignment, Class test and Seminars.
- c. Two Internal Tests of 2 hours duration may be conducted during the semester for each course / subject and the best marks may be considered and one Model Examination will be conducted at the end of the semester prior to University examination. Students may be asked to submit at least five assignments in each subject. They should also participate in Seminars conducted for each subject and marks allocated accordingly.
- d. Conduct of the continuous internal assessment shall be the responsibility of the concerned faculty.
- e. The continuous internal assessment marks are to be submitted to the University at the end of every year.
- f. The valued answer papers/assignments should be given to the students after the valuation is over and they should be asked to check up and satisfy themselves about the marks they have scored.
- g. All mark lists and other records connected with the continuous internal assessments should be in the safe custody of the institution for at least one year after the assessment.

3. ATTENDANCE:

Students must have earned 75% of attendance in each course for appearing for the examination.

Students who have earned 74% to 70% of attendance to be applied for condonation in the prescribed form with the prescribed fee.

Students who have earned 69% to 60% of attendance to be applied for condonation in the prescribed form with the prescribed fee along with the medical certificate.

Students who have below 60% of attendance are not eligible to appear for the examination.

They shall re-do the semester(s) after completion of the programme.

4. EXAMINATION:

Candidate must complete course duration to appear for the university examination. Examination will be conducted with concurrence of Controller of Examinations as per the Alagappa University regulations. University may send the representatives as the observer during examinations. University Examination will be held at the end of the each semester for duration of 3 hours for each subject. Certificate will be issued as per the AU regulations. Hall ticket will be issued to the 1st year candidates and upon submission of the list of enrolled students along with the prescribed course fee subsequent 2nd, 3rd and 4th year hall tickets will be issued.

B.Sc Optometry conducted by Alagappa University, Karaikudi, Tamil Nadu through its Collaborative Institution Rayhan Institute of Optometry and Health Science at Coimbatore.

Applicable to all the candidates admitted from the academic year 2016 onwards.

- Eligibility: A pass in Higher Secondary Examination (HSC) or Equivalent preferable with Physics, Chemistry, Biology
 or Botany or Zoology or an examination accepted as equivalent thereto by the Syndicate for admission to B.Sc
 Optometry.
- 2. For the Degree: The candidates shall have subsequently undergone the prescribed programme of study in a institute for not less than four academic years, passed the examinations prescribed and fulfill such conditions as have been prescribed therefore.
- 3.Admission: Admission is based on the marks in the qualified examination.
- 4. Duration of the course: The course shall extend over a period of Four years under semester pattern accounting to eight semesters.
